Shopping Tour to Causeway Bay

The area is particularly well renowned for its independent and quirky fashion boutiques.

Times Square is the main Causeway Bay shopping mall and SOGO is the biggest department store in Hong Kong. There is also Fashion Walk, filled with funky, independent, local retailers and the market around Jardine's Crescent.

Guests may enjoy their shopping on their own; coach will pick up guests at the designated place and return to the Harbour Grand at 17:00.

Pick up from the Harbour Grand Hotel Lobby in the morning, transfers from North Point to Central, you may amaze by the spectacular view of the surrounding city skyline, the world-famous Harbour and Kowloon. The coach rides through the Western Tunnel, the first dual three-lane harbour tunnel built in South East Asia, to the magnificent Tsing Ma Bridge. The bridge is 2.2 kilometers long; this engineering marvel is now Hong Kong's proud new landmark. Visiting the Scenery Viewing Terrace, one can see the Ting Kau Bridge, linking Tsing Yi and Tsuen Wun, the longest triplex-towered shape cable bridge of the world. Linking Tsing Yi and Lantau's transportation, another bridge known as Kap Shui Man Bridge, is also the longest hoisting cabled bridge providing for both vehicle traffic and railway transportation. These three bridges have been listed as the world's "Three Mosts". The expenditure for the engineering construction of the three bridges is also an astronomical figure. Lunch at Sham Tseng to enjoy the famous Roast Goose Cuisine, the tour will be ended at the Harbour Grand Hotel.

Information on Hong Kong

Immigration

All visitors to Hong Kong must have a passport that is valid for at least one month to six months (depending on nationality) after the period of their intended stay in Hong Kong. Please contact Immigration Department for details. Nationals of most countries do not require visas and can stay for periods varying from 7 days to 180 days, depending on nationality. If unsure of status, check with any Chinese embassy or consulate (<http://www.fmprc.gov.cn/eng/wjw/zwjg/default.htm>). Please check the details about visa requirements (http://www.immd.gov.hk/ehtml/hkvisas_4.htm) on Immigration Department's website.

Transport

Hong Kong is geographically compact and boasts one of the world's most efficient, safe, affordable and frequent public transport systems. Whether by taxi, ferry, MTR, bus or tram, you can get around easily and catch wonderful glimpses of the city along the way. For convenience, use an Octopus electronic stored-value card that is accepted on most public transport other than taxi.
